3 Conflict:

4 Crises and Climax:

The point in the literary work from which there can be no return to the previous situation; where the tension is greatest marked by action, decision, or realization in an effort to resolve the conflict.

5 Resolution:

This is where the author concludes his/her work and has fulfilled the conditions for a satisfactory ending – possibly sad – though without conflict.

6 Opinion:

Do you recommend the book?

7 Theme or Moral: What have you learned from this work?
